The Larder Lake Public Works Department would like to inform the general public of the upcoming water main flushing operations. The operations will take place **Monday, June 4, 2018 – Friday, June 8, 2018 between the hours of 8:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.**

During this period, customers may experience periods of lower pressure and discolored water. If you experience discolored water, please allow your water to run until clear.

**\*\*\*\*\*Spring Clean Up Week May 28<sup>th</sup> – June 1<sup>st</sup> 2018\*\*\*\*\***

Spring Cleanup Week will be held May 28<sup>th</sup> to June 1<sup>st</sup>, 2018. All Waste must be place at curb not later than **8:00 a.m. Friday June 1<sup>st</sup>, 2018.**

Council would like to take this time to remind all residents of the Clean and Clear By-Law #: 1217-08 being a by-law to provide for Maintaining Land in a Clean and Clear Condition. Please take this notice as an opportunity to make arrangements to dispose of these items in a proper manner. Please feel free to view a copy of the By-Law on the Township website @ [www.larderlake.ca](http://www.larderlake.ca) as well as at the Municipal Complex. Please help keep our Community Clean!

- Brush should be cut in 36 inch length and tied into bundles.
- Steel and wood products should be placed into different piles so we can separate this waste accordingly for landfill purpose.
- Yard waste should be put into containers or garbage bags no more than 50 pounds each.
- **NO CONSTRUCTION WASTE** will be picked up; this includes material such as boards, roofing materials, drywall etc.

For all residents of Larder Lake **except contractors**, tipping fees will be waived for materials to be taken to the landfill during the week of the Annual Spring Cleanup Week May 28<sup>th</sup> – June 1<sup>st</sup>, 2018. Regular tipping fees will be levied to all contractors for the disposal of construction materials at the landfill during these times.

**Please note:** that the Landfill **will not** accept refrigerators and freezers unless they have been cleared and tagged. The Landfill attendant will be checking for these tags and if not affixed to the appliance he will not allow the appliance to be disposed of at the landfill site.

**Fire Permits**

All residents are reminded that **By-Law # 1435-12 requires that all residents wishing to set or maintain an open air fire are to obtain a fire permit from the Larder Lake Fire Department.** Residents are also reminded that in the event of a fire ban being proclaimed by the Ministry of Natural Resources & Forestry, or by the Larder Lake Fire Chief, all fire permits are cancelled. You must obtain a new permit every year. We would also like to remind all residents that you may only burn wood or by-products of wood, and you are not allowed to burn prohibited substances such as kitchen garbage, construction materials and materials containing rubber, plastics, tar or any which emit a noxious or poisonous substance or pollutant. All residents who wish to have a campfire in their back yards should do so using an approved Outside Fire Pit or Outside Fireplace and they must be inspected by the Larder Lake Fire Department. **Eligibility requirements for student applicants:**

Students hired by recipient organizations must meet the eligibility criteria of the program:

- All students must be currently enrolled in a secondary, or post-secondary institution or within six months of graduation and have reached the age of 15 and not yet reached the age of 25 upon commencement of employment or up to 29 years for persons with a disability, if disabled, within the meaning of s.10 of the Ontario *Human Rights Code*, R.S.O. 1990, c. H.19, as amended from time to time.
- Students must be employed full time for a minimum employment contract length of 217.5 hours or 30 days at 7.25 hours per day.
- Proof of student enrolment must be provided to the employer.
- Students must be residents of Ontario during the period of employment.
- Students must be eligible to work in Canada and have a Social Insurance Number (SIN).

Note: The student must be living in Ontario at the time they start work. The intention of the program is to provide career related experience to eligible students that are also eligible to work in Ontario.

## MUNICIPAL OFFICES

Nominations in the Municipality of the Township of Larder Lake for the offices of:

**Mayor: One to be elected**

**Councillors: Four to be elected**

May be made by completing and filing in the office of the Clerk, nominations on the prescribed form and accompanied by the prescribed nomination filing fee of \$200 for the Head of Council and \$100 for all other offices. The filing fee is payable by cash, certified cheque, money order or electronic payment if specified by the Clerk.

A nomination must be signed by the candidate and may be filed in person or by an agent during regular business hours between May 1, 2018, and July 26, 2018, and between 9:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. on July 27, 2018 (Nomination Day).

In the event there are an insufficient number of certified candidates to fill all positions available, nominations will be reopened for the vacant positions only on Wednesday, August 1, 2018, between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. and such additional nominations, if required, may be filed in the Office of the Clerk.

Electors are hereby given notice that if a greater number of candidates are certified than are required to fill the said offices, voting places will be opened on the dates stated below for the purpose of voting.

## **KEY INFORMATION TO MUNICIPAL ELECTORS REGARDING THE 2018 MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS**

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### **Who Can Vote?**

A person is entitled to vote in a municipal election if he or she on voting day,

- resides in the local municipality, or is the owner or tenant of land in the municipality, or the spouse of such owner or tenant; and
- is a Canadian citizen, and
- is at least 18 years old, and
- is not prohibited from voting under the Municipal Elections Act, 1996 or otherwise prohibited by law

### **Who Cannot Vote?**

The following cannot vote:

- a person who is serving a sentence of imprisonment in penal or correctional institution;
- a corporation;
- a person acting as executor or trustee or in any other representative capacity, except as a voting proxy in a traditional election;
- a person who was convicted of the corrupt practice described in subsection 90 (3), if voting in the current election is less than five years after voting day in the election in respect of which her or she was convicted.

### **Are You on the Voters' List?**

The List of eligible voters for the upcoming municipal election has been prepared by the Returning Officer/Clerk of your municipality. We all play a role in ensuring a fair electoral system, and it is the responsibility of every elector to make sure their information is up-to-date and accurately reflected for electoral purposes. Eligible Electors can log into [voterlookup.ca](http://voterlookup.ca) to:

- confirm or update their electoral information;
- add an elector name to an address;
- change school support;

Alternatively to be added, deleted or to make any other corrections to your information, contact or visit the municipal office where you are entitled to vote, with proper identification and proof of residence during normal office hours beginning September 4 up to and including the close of voting on October 22 at 8 p.m.

Electors will be voting by traditional ballot. Electors will be notified of their voting station and advanced voting dates in early October.

In order to vote, the elector must attend the voting station on October 22, 2018 and cast their ballot. To be added to the Voter's List the voter must have acceptable identification and proof of residence.
